Grant Applications Being Accepted Beginning January 3, 2005

CAMBRIDGE, VT – Intelepresence wireless covert surveillance and counter-terrorism systems that operate in the most remote and extreme conditions, are now available at no cost to state and local law enforcement agencies through a unique federal grant program that will accept applications beginning January 3, 2005. The program is administered by the U.S. Army Electronic Proving Ground (EPG), Special Programs Office on behalf of the Office of National Drug Control Policy, Counterdrug Technology Assessment Center.

The Technology Transfer Program matches systems and devices with state or local law enforcement agency requirements, provides equipment training and transfers the equipment as to the recipient agency for deployment and operations. The equipment becomes the permanent property of the recipient agency. The program's primary efforts are directed to state and local law enforcement agencies in High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTAs).

The Technology Transfer Program application is available at www.epgctac.com. Agencies may submit the application online via the website, along with a signed letter of request that must be mailed on agency letterhead. The letter must be signed by senior management (police chief, sheriff) and must request participation in the program and agree to provide feedback and evaluation reports assessing the impact, beneficial or not, of the technology on the agency's law enforcement efforts. The EPG is specifically interested in seizures (quantity and type), number of arrests and news highlights from television, newspapers, magazines or other publications.
